WHAT IS STORMWATER SMART?

Stormwater SMART is a collaboration of eighteen local governments working together to increase people's understanding of the impacts of stormwater runoff pollution on local streams and lakes and to promote and encourage changes in common practices around schools, homes, farms and businesses that will reduce pollutant loads in stormwater runoff



How to Earn You Stormwater SMART Patch

1. Schedule a Presentation
2. Complete Stormwater Activity Book
3. Complete a community/school survey
4. Participate in a Stormwater Event
5. Develop a Stormwater runoff solution project for your school or community
6. Arrange a presentation for similar organizations or science classes

1. Stormwater Presentations

The Stormwater SMART staff is available for presentations to troops. The presentations include:

- Power Point *Stormwater in a Changing Landscape*,
- Enviroscapc Demonstration,
- Trivia quiz where troop members can win prizes.

2. Complete Stormwater Activity Book

The Stormwater Activity book allows troops to gain basic information on water quality pollution and Stormwater runoff.

3. Complete a Community/School Survey

Part of the Stormwater SMART Challenge requires troops to walk around their community or school yard and discover how those areas can improve their Stormwater runoff problem.



4. Participate in a Stormwater SMART Event

Stormwater SMART hosts several events a year that your troop can participate in:

- North Carolina Big Sweep (fall),
- Stormwater SMART Day (spring)
- If you are looking for something for all year, then you can join our Stream Watch program where your troop can adopt a stream and monitor over the course of a year.



5. Develop and Implement Stormwater Solutions

Troops could find a place in your community or on your school grounds for a rain garden or wetland to be developed with the support of the Stormwater SMART program

- Create a Pick up the Poop campaign in your neighborhood.
- Also, you can make suggestions to your school on how they can clean up the grounds and fertilize the fields.
- Conduct an outreach event in your neighborhood or school

Requirements

- Daisies and Brownies should complete 1,2, & 3
- Juniors should complete 1,3, & 4
- Cadettes and Seniors should complete 1, 3, 4 and either 5 or 6.
